

THE EAST COAST MARINERS.

This genealogical story has probably been the most arduous and unsatisfying of the whole series, partly due to the variation of the surname. The very early members of the family in Lowestoft were recorded as Fairhead's, then Farretts, to followed by Ferretts, some of which reverted again to Farretts, others finally becoming Fairhead's again, but a number of the Ferretts and Farretts do not appear to have reverted to Fairhead's, but seem to have disappeared.

The name Ferrett or Farrett does not seem to be in use much today, although at the beginning of the century there were many carrying the name, and one may now ask, Where have they all gone ? Records from 1650 until early this century register the three names and it becomes exceedingly difficult to determine whether one is dealing with the Fairhead Family when locating entries under these names. A number of Lowestoft records read "Fairhead or Farrett" so it would appear that these individuals did not know what their name really was, an unbelievable thought today.

It is more that two years since I discovered that the Family had invaded this East Coast town, and since that time I have been working in order to build this story, with the most disappointing results. This has been frustration in the first order. Many visits have been made to London covering searches at the Public Record Office, The Guildhall Library, Somerset House, St. Catherine's House, and The County Hall, also the Record Office at Ipswich, the Library at Lowestoft, and much time spent at records in Norwich, to say nothing of a complete correspondence course with the custodians of the archives at Newcastle, Durham and Sunderland, and the many private individuals who have kindly attempted to deal with my requests, but fate rules as a nonentity.

I do feel, however, that it would be unfortunate if the result of my work was lost. So I now record my findings and perhaps others may be able to add to this story.

After much pondering, I have come to the conclusion (without any real evidence I hasten to add) that the family that invaded the town of Lowestoft were of the Beccles stock of Thomas the Weaver of 1520 (See page 3 of The Suffolk Weavers)

Doubtless a number of readers will fault some of the statements made and may be able to give a truer account of the happenings. This can be only part of the full story and any additions will be most welcome.

My findings for the early period include :-

Isaac (Fayer) ⁽²⁷⁷⁹⁾ born in 1545, a weaver of Lowestoft who married Alice **Rooden** ⁽²⁷⁸⁰⁾ on the 12th September 1575. Isaac died on the 4th August 1585 and Alice in 1587. They are known to have had two children :-

These could be the children of Thomas Fayerhed 1520 [\(14\)](#) of Beccles (Suffolk Weavers Branch).

I (Albert) also found that there was an :-

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I (Albert) have no record of the families of Thomas 1565 [\(2781\)](#) or Robert 1560 [\(2782\)](#).

The first record that I (Albert) have in Lowestoft in the name of Fairhead is that of :-

The first 4 children were born at Great Yarmouth, and the last 3 at Lowestoft. Hannah, the mother died on the 25th February 1741 and John married Rose **Tripp** [\(2801\)](#) at Lowestoft on the 18th July 1742. There were two children by this second marriage :-

both by the name of Fairhead.

Rose (Tripp), the mother, died on the 26th March 1752,

and John 'Faret' now of Great Yarmouth, the Register states "formally of Lowestoft", married Sarah **Adams** (2804) at Lowestoft on the 7th January 1755. There do not appear to be any children by this union. I (Albert) have little more information concerning this family, except :-

Caroline 1701 (2792) No record.

there was a **Thomas Fairhead** (2806), an unmarried man, who died on the 6th September 1748, who could have been a member of this family.

It appears that John 1689 had a second wife, Sarah ? (2812), who died in 1768. John died on the 19th June 1773, aged 84.

Elizabeth 1728 (2809) (dau. of above) married Thomas **Rumor** (2811) on the 7th December 1756 at Lowestoft, Suffolk. Neither Elizabeth nor the "Clerk" were aware of the correct surname as the register reads "Faret of Fairhead".

There was another James born about 1783, parents unknown, possibly of this family and a replacement for the one that died in 1777. This :-

James 1783 “Ferrett”, sometimes known as Farrer, also became a Lowestoft Harbour Pilot. He married Alice **Cullingham** ⁽²⁸⁵⁰⁾ (possibly a relation to Elizabeth the wife of John on page 4) in 1803 and they had the following family :-

James, the father, died whist out to Sea on the 8th April 1860, and is buried in St. Margaret’s Churchyard, Lowestoft. A memorial stone marks the grave. I (Albert) do not know what happened to the family of James, but possibly they have become merged into the name Farrer.

Benjamin was christened at the Presbyterian Old Meeting House, Goal Street, Great Yarmouth, Norfolk. He was listed as ‘Ferret’ These were also mentioned as Fairhead. Cornelius, the father, died on the 9th July 1761.

Mary, the mother, died about 2 years after the birth of Sarah at the age of 34 years, (possibly at the birth of another child) on the 6th December 1770.

John 1763 ⁽²⁸²⁵⁾ like many before and since, became a Shipmaster. He married Elizabeth **Cullingham** ⁽³²³²⁾ on the 22nd December 1781, but Elizabeth died on the 14th May 1805 and a second marriage took place, as when John died in 1813 his widow was Mary ⁽³²³³⁾.

Mary 1764 ⁽²⁸²⁶⁾ was baptised on the 25th November of that year, at the age of 10 days.

James Cross 1766 ⁽²⁸²⁷⁾ also died at a very young age on the 24th May 1767.

John 1768 (Farrett) ⁽²⁸⁶⁰⁾ had a maritime record. He married Phoebe **Barrett** ⁽²⁸⁶⁸⁾ on the 21st July 1793 at Lowestoft, to bring about the following family :-

The Baptisms took place at Lowestoft, Suffolk. I (Albert) am told that there were 17 in this family, but it would appear that it is a great probability that some were brought about by another mother.

I (Richard) have looked closely at these birth dates, which range over 29 years, at least 3 died very young i.e. John 1796, Samuel 1802 and Patience Barrett 1816, so I think that 17 is quite possible. Also as 3 of the last 5 have Barrett as a second name it is probable that Phoebe was mother to all of them.

The family lived in Nelson Street, Lowestoft, mostly under the name of Ferrett, but sometimes, particularly in the later years, under the name of Farrett.

John, the father, spent much of his time at Sea where he met his end in August 1825. Phoebe, John's widow, inherited his estate, which included shares in Boats and Yawls of every description. Phoebe died on the 5th March 1861, at the age of 90 years, and was buried in Lowestoft. Two of which were called the "Washington" & the "Providence".

Albert was told by The Trinity House Pilotage Service that John served as a Master and Master's Mate on both warships and merchant ships. He joined the Pilotage Service being licensed on the 21st November 1808 at the age of 40 years. He resided at Lowestoft, he developed into a thickset, muscular man of 5ft 4ins, complexion fair, hair light brown. He served for the North Channels of the London District and while proceeding to the cruising station at Smiths Knoll in August 1825 the Pilot Cutter "Ebenezer" was overset by a gale and he was drowned with three other Pilots.

After John's death Phoebe, who became the sole beneficiary under his will, moved to 109 South Turnpike, Lowestoft, where she died at the great age of 90 years on the 5th March 1861.

Her son, Samuel 1802, who also became a Trinity House Pilot, was living with her at this address, together with a daughter, Patience 1822.

Elizabeth 1770 ⁽²⁸⁶¹⁾ produced a son out of wedlock :-

She then married Samuel **Butcher** (2833) on the 11th November 1788 at Lowestoft. From this it can be assumed that Samuel was the father.

William 1774 (2863) died in infancy.

William 1775 (2864) married Elizabeth **Standford** (2883) in about the year 1799 and they had the following family :-

Cornelius served as a Foremastman on board the "Iris" in 1802 and it was some thirty years later when he joined the Pilotage Service. Unlike John 1768 who was only 5ft 4ins in height Cornelius was 6ft tall. His hair was brown. He resigned in 1848. Cornelius died on the 3rd February 1865 at the age of 84 years, Elizabeth having died eight years earlier in 1857.

Thomas 1788 (2867) No record.

4th Generation

Phoebe 1793 (2869) married ? **Jenner** (2892). She died on the 26th June 1875 and is buried with her mother at St Margaret's, Lowestoft.

John 1796 (2870) died in 1797, and was buried on the 2nd March of that year.

John 1798 (2871) No record.

Ann 1801 (2872) married Adam **George** (2893) on the 6th May 1823.

Samuel 1802 (2873) probably died and was replaced by Samuel 1805.

Mary 1805 ⁽²⁸⁷⁴⁾ No record, except that she was a witness at her sister Ann's wedding.

Samuel 1805 ⁽²⁸⁷⁵⁾ became a Trinity House Pilot. He is recorded as a Yarmouth Pilot. He was 5ft 5ins with brown hair. He had shares in a number of Pilot Vessels. He remained unmarried and lived with his mother, dying on the 11th April 1860

Elizabeth 1807 "Farret" ⁽²⁸⁷⁶⁾ married Daniel **West** ⁽²⁸⁹⁴⁾ of Lowestoft on the 10th August 1827.

Eliza 1810 ⁽²⁸⁷⁷⁾ remained unmarried and died on the 22nd January 1831 aged 20 years.

Robert 1811 ⁽⁸⁶⁴⁷⁾ No record.

Robert Barrett 1812 ⁽²⁸⁷⁸⁾ No record.

Patience Barrett 1816 ⁽²⁸⁷⁹⁾ probably died prematurely and was replaced by Patience 1822.

William Barrett 1818 ⁽²⁸⁸⁰⁾ No record.

Patience 1822 ⁽²⁸⁸¹⁾ remained unmarried and died on the 17th May 1894. She was buried at St. Margaret's, Lowestoft.

Richard 1822 ⁽²⁸⁸²⁾ No record.

Samuel Butcher (Farrett) 1788 ⁽²⁸⁸²⁾ having retained his mother's name, joined the Fairhead fishermen.

William Standford (Ferrett) 1800 ⁽²⁸⁸⁴⁾ married Mary Susannah **Taylor** ⁽²⁸⁹⁵⁾ on the 1st May 1826 at Corton, Suffolk, to bring about the following family :-

Three of this family died young, and also the mother, Mary Susannah, was not blessed with a normal life span and died on the 19th January 1838 at the age of 37 years. She and three of her children were buried at St. Margaret's, Lowestoft. One memorial stone marks the graves of Susannah, William Taylor and John, while another close by mentions the third son, Benjamin Standford Ferrett.

It appears that William Standford married again and his choice was Margaret ? ⁽²⁹⁰⁰⁾ who became the mother of this family :-

William Standford, the father, who also became a Trinity House Pilot, He was licensed in 1826, for the North Channels extended to the Dudgeon in 1829 and served until he was pensioned in 1866. He died on the 23rd April 1878, while Margaret, now "Farrett", died at 41 Nelson Street, Lowestoft at the age of 84 years on the 26th

September 1894. Both were buried at St. Margaret's, Lowestoft.

John Standford (Farrett) 1805 (2885) No record.

Maria 1803 (2887) married James **Reynolds** (2905) of Lowestoft on the 24th April 1828. They had one son :-
