

The Shoemakers of Rayleigh.

This is but a brief genealogical story of the Family at Ramsden and Rayleigh, but some information has been added recently to bring the records up to the present day. Doubtless a number of readers will fault some of the statements made and may be able to give a truer account of the happenings. This can be only part of the full story and any additions will be most welcome.

Since the death of Albert (in 1976) material has been gathered by the late Mr. G.T. Where places are described as a 'District', this is the Registration District where the event was Registered. These were introduced in 1837, and the names and boundaries of many of these Districts have changed over the years since. The earliest record to date is that of **Edward** ⁽²⁶³⁹⁾ of Ramsden Bellhouse, born about the year **1650**. It cannot be determined from what stock he came, but researches might reveal that he too came from the early stock mentioned in "**The Essex Farmers**". He was a Cordwainer, a trade better known as a Shoemaker, and a son, Edward ⁽²⁶⁴¹⁾, was born to his wife Elizabeth ⁽²⁶⁴⁰⁾ about the year 1680. Elizabeth was recorded as a widow in 1717 so Edward had died before this date.

Edward 1680 ⁽²⁶⁴¹⁾ married Ann ? ⁽²⁶⁴²⁾ and they had the following family :-

Edward (1680) had a shop with house and five acres of land at Ramsden Grays and carried on the family trade as a Cordwainer. He was reasonably well off and when he died in 1748 he left the business to his son Edward with cash benefits to the other children.

The 2nd Generation.

Edward 1722 ⁽²⁶⁴⁵⁾ married Ann **Page** on the 25th February 1745 at Mountnessing, Essex, but there were no children and Ann died before her husband, who died in 1768. From his Will the property was left to Joseph (1729), with cash payments to his sisters in the same manner as his father's Will.

Lucy 1728 ⁽²⁶⁴⁶⁾ No record.

Joseph 1729 ⁽²⁶⁴⁷⁾ moved to the town of Rayleigh, possibly a better centre for the trade of Cordwainer, and was now described as a Shoemaker. He married Penelope **Kendal** ⁽²⁶⁴⁹⁾ (bap. 1st May 1728, dau. of John ⁽⁴⁴³⁵⁾ & Mary Kendall ⁽⁴⁴³⁶⁾) on the 8th April 1752 at St. Peters, South Hanningfield, Rayleigh, and they had three sons :-

Penelope died on the 28th February 1758 in Rayleigh, Essex.

The widower, Joseph, then married Susannah **Rutter** ⁽²⁶⁵³⁾ (b. abt 1735 d 29/11/1824) on the 19th October 1758 at Thundersley, Essex, and the ensuing large family came along as follows :-

William 1761 (2654) carried on the Shoemakers business at Rayleigh and also became Postmaster of the Town. He married Elizabeth **Smith** (2668) (of Great Burstead) on the 2nd June 1785, at Holy Trinity Church in Rayleigh, and they had the following family :-

William, the father, did not live to a great age and died on the 16th May 1806 and was buried at Rayleigh. In Jan 1829 a letter to the post-master general complains about the conduct of the widow who is the receiver of letters at Rayleigh. The widow Mrs **Benton** (she married William **Benton** (3313) on the 25th October 1808) was removed from this position, and her son-in-law William **Pissey** (4048) appointed to the post. The Rayleigh burial register has the following entry:

1837 Elizabeth **Benton**, late mistress of Post Office, widow of William Fairhead, Rayleigh, aged 76 was buried May 2.

Susannah 1763 (2660) married William **Sharp** (4546) on the 31st May 1792 at St. Martin's, Birmingham, Warwick.

Jephthan 1766 (2655) married and went to live in the neighbouring Rochford. This first wife (2688) died shortly after the turn of the century, and Jephthan married Amy **Rudkin** (2674) of Rochford, Essex on the 25th February 1806 and two children were born to this union :-

There is no record of what happened to these, but the father died at the age of 60 years and was buried at Rayleigh on the 12th April 1826. Amy had a son before their marriage, born in 1803 who was William Wells **Rudkin** (4673).

Tracey 1767 (2659) married a Mr Smith (3478).

Elizabeth 1769 (2661) No record.

Sarah 1771 (2662) married William **Whichcord** (2681) (a widower who had previously been married to Elizabeth **Usher** (5991) in 1787) on the 4th July 1799 at Rayleigh. They lived at Fryerning near Ingatestone. William Whichcord is listed in the 1832 electoral roll. Sarah Whichcord is living alone in the 1841 census, and her death was registered Jan-Mar 1851.

Thomas 1773 (2656) married Sarah **White** (2677) (b. abt 1771 d 28/4/1848) at Rayleigh, on the 17th December 1794. He was the father of the unfortunate Thomas who was hanged for Sheep stealing in 1820 (see "Murder, Facts & Fiction" by A.E.Fairhead, where the account is told, this Thomas was born in 1796). They are known to have had a son and two daughters :-

Thomas died on the 8th July 1840, at the age of 67, and was buried at Rayleigh on the 10th July 1840. Sarah was buried on the 28th April 1848. Albert felt that these two might be the forebears of many present day Fairhead's.

Eleanor 1775 (2663) married ? **Joslin** (2682).

George 1777 (2657) became a Grocer and Draper in the town of Rayleigh. He married and Ann ? (2678) and a son was born at Great Braxted. The son was :-

George died in 1856, in the Rochford District, Essex.

Lucy Ann Charlotte 1779 (2658) remained unmarried and died at the age of 75 years and was buried at Rayleigh on the 9th January 1854.

Sophia 1787 (2673) died of Smallpox and was buried on the 27th November 1787.

William Smith 1788 ⁽²⁶⁶⁹⁾ was a Carpenter by trade. He married Rebecca **Bradley** ⁽²⁶⁸³⁾ at Prittlewell, Essex on the 11th January 1811 and they had the following family, all born at Southend :-

In 1841 William was living with his wife and two of his daughters, Elizabeth & Martha at Wellington Place, Southend. Rebecca died in 1841 and was buried at St. Mary's, Prittlewell on the 12th September 1841.

In 1851 he was a widower and was living with daughters Martha & Jane at 11 Fairhead Road or Row, Southend. By the time of the 1861 Census, William was living with his daughter Martha and her husband and family at 3 Albert Place, Southend. William died in 1866 and was buried on the 2nd December 1866 also at St Mary's.

Lucy 1791 ⁽²⁶⁷⁰⁾ married William **Pissey** ⁽⁴⁰⁴⁸⁾, a Draper and Post Office keeper, on the 4th March 1817, and they had a family of nine children. Lucy was buried at Rayleigh on the 31st December 1866. William was buried at Rayleigh on the 18th November 1876.

Joseph 1793 ⁽²⁷³²⁾ died and was buried on the 26th February 1794.

Thomas 1796 ⁽²⁶⁸⁹⁾ Something, which can be added to, the story concerning Thomas is an extract from "Essex Countryside" dated February 1968, is :-

" My Great Grandmother, Sarah Monk, washed the shirt of one of the last men to be hanged for sheep stealing in 1820. I would never have mentioned it, had it not been for Mr. J.Wentworth-Day's controversial article "Old fashioned justice" in your last issue. This article recalled unpleasantly the days of Stocks and Whipping Posts and times not so long ago when starving vagrants would be soundly flogged and sent to the next village to receive a similar treatment there.

But about my great grandmother, who my father told me, lived in Pettywell and had a lodger named Henry Gilliot, who was a Shepherd at Temple Farm under Thomas Laver.

Gilliot had a friend in Rochford named Thomas Fairhead. This man was a butcher and was on good terms with the Innkeeper at the 'Old Ship' in Rochford, who allowed him to keep a stall in the Inn yard. Fairhead was engaged to marry Mary Walter, the Publican's daughter.

With this set up it was a simple matter to steal sheep from Temple Farm and later dispose of them at the Rochford butcher's stall, but someone got wind of this profitable business and the Law took over. Henry Gilliot (wearing the shirt my great grandmother had washed for him) and Thomas Fairhead - both under 24 years old, says Benton's

History, were taken to Chelmsford Goal. There they were tried and found guilty of theft, being executed on the 24th March 1820.

To quote Benton, "Thomas Fairhead had the previous 26th March 1819, witnessed the execution of Simon George Baker, known as 'Gentleman George', for burglary at Cold Norton. Fairhead remarked afterwards that he little thought as sat on his horse during the last struggles of Simon that he would come to the same end. Now the whole point of this true story seems to me to be in the last sentence which proves that the witnessing of Baker's hanging was no deterrent to Fairhead's swift progress to the scaffold only a year later on a similar charge. In the days of those dreadful hanging laws, when a criminal knew that he might as well murder as to thieve, for the penalty was the same."

William 1811 (3945) died shortly after birth and was buried on the 17th November 1811 at St, Mary's, Prittlewell.

William Miles 1813 (2684) was also a carpenter by trade like his father. He married Sarah **Robinson** (2690) (b.1813/14) on the 22nd September 1835 at St. Nicholas, Deptford, London and they had the following family :-

It is not known why Sarah Jane was baptised in North Yorkshire, unless they had moved there for work. Sarah, the wife, died in 1843 at Rochford, Essex, probably due to childbirth and was buried on the 23rd May 1843 at St. Mary's, Prittlewell.

William Miles married for a second time to Mary Ann **Gibbs** (2694) (b. 1813, Leigh, Essex) on the 4th November 1843 at St. Mary's, Whitechapel, London. This marriage brought forth the following family all born at Southend, Essex :-

Both Baptisms were at St John the Baptist, Southend, Essex

At the time of the 1851 census William was living at 4 Wellington Place Southend with Mary Ann, his wife, Sarah Jane and William from his first marriage and Elizabeth, Jane and John of his second marriage, and also a servant, 19 year old Mary Ann **Hall**. It can be assumed from this that Rebecca, the third child from his first marriage died at birth and brought about the death of the wife Sarah. William died on the 15th August 1883 and was buried on the 20th at St John the Baptist, Rayleigh. Mary, his wife, died on the 8th February 1887 and was buried on the 14th.

Martha 1816 (4045) died aged 15 months and was buried on the 28th December 1817 at St. Mary's.

George 1819 (4046) died aged 2 weeks and was buried on the 28th June 1819 also at St. Mary's

Elizabeth 1824 (2685) married William **Perkins** (4049) (bap. 3/10/1824), stated to be an Ostler / Cab proprietor, in the last quarter of 1850 at Bethnal Green District, London. They had the following family :-

William 1841 (2692) was baptised on the 21st February 1841 at St. Mary's, Prittlewell. He carried on the family tradition of working in wood and became a Joiner. He married Rhoda Ann **Paul** (2702) (b. 22.9.1835) on the 28th July 1862 at St. Mary's Marylebone, London and they had the following family :-

Not long after this the whole family immigrated to New Zealand; the name of the ship was named "The Clarence". They sailed from London on the 24th September 1874, with a total of 324 passengers. The journey took 103 days and they arrived in Hawkes Bay, at a cost of £16-10-0 per adult. One of the children, the youngest, George Walter died on the journey and was buried at sea. William, the father, wrote a poem which sums up what many emigrants must have felt in similar circumstances.

*We can no never forget
That sad and eventful morn,
When on the good ship Clarence we went
And carried our youngest born.*

*Instead of the churchyard green
To the billows deep and wild,
We gave encased in canvas coarse
The form of our darling child.*

*How the little one laughed and cried
And clapped his hands in glee,
At the cruel waves that proved his xxxxxxxx
For we buried our babe at sea.*

*And although no power on earth
Our dear little boy could save,
It's hard to know that we ne'er can stand
By his quiet silent grave.*

*Midway on the restless deep
No vessel or land in sight,
We saw from his eyes fade out and die
Their beautiful living light.*

*We can never plant bright flowers
To blossom sweet and nice
And cover his silent resting place
For we buried our babe at sea.*

The baby died of malnutrition in 1874. In all 27 died from Scarlet Fever, food was scarce and there was no milk or water. Mrs Fairhead nearly died also, the sailors brought up canvas to sew her up but she started singing "a few more years shall roll " and the Doctor allowed her some brandy and she recovered.

Rhoda died on the 3rd August 1918 at 140 Broad St. Palmeston North and was buried at the Terrace End Cemetery on the 5th August. William died on the 6th November 1922 at the same address and was buried in the same cemetery on the 7th November.
